Caretaking & cleaning duties	Cleaning in non-healthcare settings during COVID19 pandemic.	Staff/ Pupils	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Risk from residual infectious virus significantly reduces after 48 hours. Continue to store personal waste from symptomatic persons for 72 hours to elapse before disposal after symptomatic person has vacated site; Strict compliance with use of PPE. Hands must be washed with soap & hot water for 20 seconds minimum after PPE has been removed; As a minimum, <u>frequently touched surfaces</u> should be wiped down at <u>the beginning and at the end of each day</u> using standard cleaning products such as detergents and bleach, paying attention to all surfaces but especially ones that are touched frequently, such as <u>door handles, light switches, work surfaces, remote controls and electronic devices</u>; COSHH RA's in place for cleaning materials; Avoid creating splashes and spray when cleaning; 	4	2	8	M	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> *If there is visible contamination with body fluids, then the need for additional PPE to protect the cleaner's eyes, mouth and nose might be necessary. The local Public Health England (PHE) Health Protection Team (HPT) can give guidance on required standards; For Kitchen & Dining areas the cleaning products must comply & display either of these codes: BS EN 1276 or BS EN 13697

			<p>6. It is very unlikely that COVID-19 is transmitted through food. However, anyone handling food should wash their hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds before doing so. Crockery and eating utensils should not be shared. Clean frequently touched surfaces regularly;</p> <p>7. Laundry - Wash items in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions;</p> <p>8. Waste does not need to be segregated unless an individual in the setting shows symptoms of or tests positive for COVID-19. Routine waste can be disposed of as normal, placing any used cloths or wipes in 'black bag' waste bins. They do not need to put in an extra bag or store them for a time before throwing them away.</p>
