Dear Parents and Carers,

Greetings, Super Parents! A huge welcome to Busy Bees and it is our intention to provide you with support and information that means we can all effectively work together as a team to help your child's progress this term.

Our main class routines are as follows:

Monday- Read, Write, Inc Speed Spell (only for children who receive a Read, Write, Inc Log Book)

Wednesday- Miss Bowcott will teach the class. It is also P.E day. Busy Bees children come to school in their P.E uniform. Please note from previous email (pre-summer) the standards expected for P.E uniform and dress-code.

Readers- Your child will have set days that they are read with individually in addition to their daily group reading tasks in phonics/spelling lessons. The days on which your child reads individually with a member of staff will be the day that their book is changed. If your child's book is not changed on their day, this may be due to an error on our part or it may be because your child will need further practise on the book at home. The latter will be communicated in your child's Reading Record.

Bringing in things from home- To reiterate, toys from home are not allowed. This is to ensure precious things do not get damaged, lost or lead to arguments.

Just a reminder of the two types of Homework:
