Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back after hopefully what has been a lovely Easter break. Having seen the children grow so much last term, we're excited to continue to work on their skills, independence and confidence as they slowly move closer to becoming a Year 3.

Our main class routines for the summer are as follows (there may be some changes):

Monday and Tuesday- Miss Way will teach the class.

Monday- Read, Write, Inc Speed Spell (only for children who receive a Read, Write, Inc Log Book)

Tuesday is also Forest School day for the first four weeks of the first half of the summer term.

P.E- PE day is Thursday before half term and Tuesday after half term. Busy Bees children come to school in their P.E uniform, adhering to the standards and dress-code. Swimming will take place in the afternoons of the first two weeks after half term. Children come to school in normal uniform and bring their swimming kit in a bag.

Friday- Friday will be "Buzzy Maths" time and will include a timed Maths test for children on their arithmetic skills. Children will receive a specific times table or set of number facts to learn over the week. It is essential these are practised to help their rapid recall of facts needed to do trickier work as they progress through school. The number facts that the children receive may be different to each other as these are based on their confidence level and success with the timed tests.

Readers- Please refer to the coloured Guided Reading timetable that is stuck inside the cover of your child's Reading Record. Your child will have set days that they are read with individually in addition to their daily group reading tasks in phonics/spelling lessons. The days on which your child reads individually with a member of staff will be the day that their book is changed. If your child's book is not changed on their day, this may be due to an error on our part or it may be because your child will need further practise on the book at home. The latter will be communicated in your child's Reading Record.

Bringing in things from home- To reiterate, toys from home are not allowed. This is to ensure precious things do not get damaged, lost or lead to arguments. Jewellery (excluding stud earrings) and make-up/nail varnish is also not part of our uniform policy. Please take time to refer to the policy if unsure.

Just a reminder of the two types of Homework:

- **5 a day** Important activities, which should be done regularly. Most of these can be done in short, sharp bursts. Everyone is busy but these activities really do have an impact on your child's progress. It's important to develop a routine at home to allow for these activities to take place.
- Weekly Treats Creative ideas or projects. These are optional and there's not a set day for these to be handed in during the specified week. Any items handed in will be showcased in class and used to support what's being learnt in lessons.
